

Background: health care reform in Finland in 2023

A major reform for organizing public healthcare, social welfare and rescue services took place in 2023 as the services were transferred from municipalities and joint municipal authorities (n=309) to well-being services counties (n=21 + City of Helsinki and Helsinki University Hospital).

This change in service provision arrangements aimed to e.g.

- create better integration between primary and specialised health care and social services
- safeguard equal and quality health and social services
- reduce inequalities in health and well-being
- secure the supply of skilled employees
- improve the quality and availability of services
- contain expenditure growth.



Why to invest on APN? National level

International research evidence on the benefits associated with Advanced Practice Nurses, such as

- positive linkage of access to care and outcomes
- the attractiveness of the health and social services sector and the job satisfaction of nursing professionals
- potentially reduced costs

>>> consistent with the objectives of the Finnish social and healthcare reform, taken in 2023

Especially

- systematic use of APN job descriptions in services for older people could bring
 - better quality of services
 - fewer emergency room visits
 - increased attractiveness of the gerontological nursing speciality.
- also benefits in the prevention and treatment of various non-communicable diseases, including the increasing need for mental health services.





Recommendations 2023

- The roles and education of Advanced Practice
 Nurses are outlined in a national ministerial level advisory board.
- There is close collaboration between the education system and the working life.
- 3. Wellbeing services counties systematically utilize and increase the positions of Advanced Practice Nurses.
- 4. Advanced Practice Nurses are involved in the social and health services development committees
- 5. Organizations produce and analyze effectiveness assessment data of Advanced Practice Nursing.



Why to invest on APN? EU and European level

APN has a key role to play in building the resilience of the health and care system in the EU and Europe.

EFN is calling upon the EU Institutions and other health stakeholders to join efforts and make rapid progress in developing advanced practice nursing in the EU and Europe by:

- Promoting evidence-based nursing, patient safety, universal health coverage (UHC), sustainable development goals (SDGs), high quality care, nurse retention and recruitment by fostering APN roles in EU area;
- Facilitating member states to develop nationally agreed-upon, as a minimum, master's level standards for preparation programmes for advanced practice nursing;
- Facilitating member states to establish formal recognition and licensing (protected title) of APN nurses at the national level; and
- Exploring the potential for a European framework for advanced practice nursing, that can be used at national level to enable regulation, mobility, national and international comparison, cooperation in research and development and sharing of expertise.








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Online questionnaire to 35 national nurses' associations across Europe in March 2021, response rate 100%

Key findings

- Huge variations across Europe
 - definition, sense-making, operationalization, requirements, competencies, scope of practice, level of education and training
- Also: significant progress, great opportunities and persisting challenges
- 57% (n = 20) reported that advanced practice nurses were established in their country
- 31% (n = 11) reported the existence of a national legislation establishing minimum educational requirements.
- Lack of clarity on the development and implementation of advanced practice nursing
- More research is needed
 - to clarify whether variation results from designing models of advanced practice nursing that work in different contexts
 - what impact a standardized regulatory framework could have to grow the volume of advanced practice nurses across Europe.
- Next steps of the working group: Road map to develop APN roles, renew the survey
- Future: developing standardisation of advanced nursing practice across Europe?
